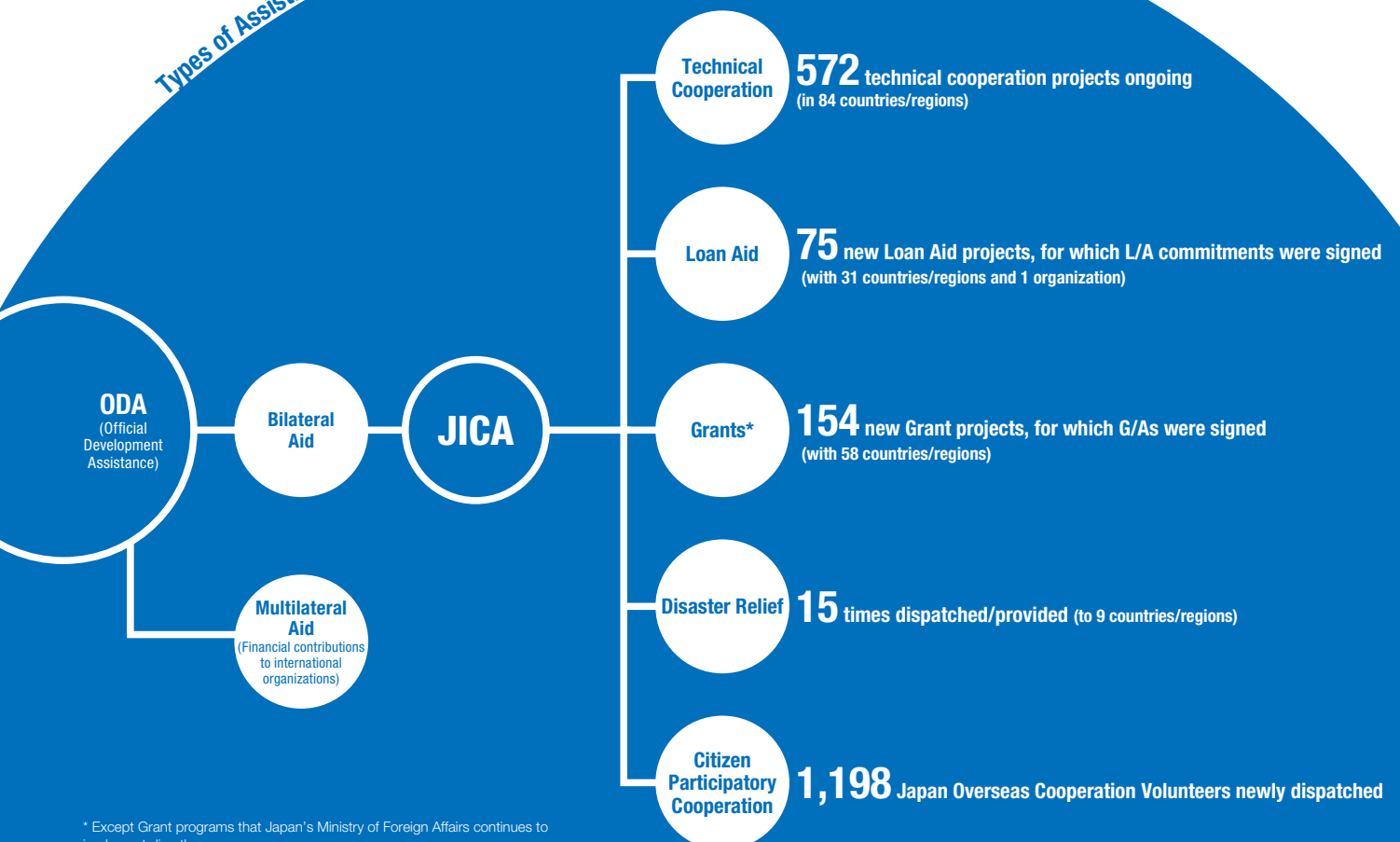


JICA, in charge of administering Japan's ODA, is one of the world's largest bilateral aid agencies.
