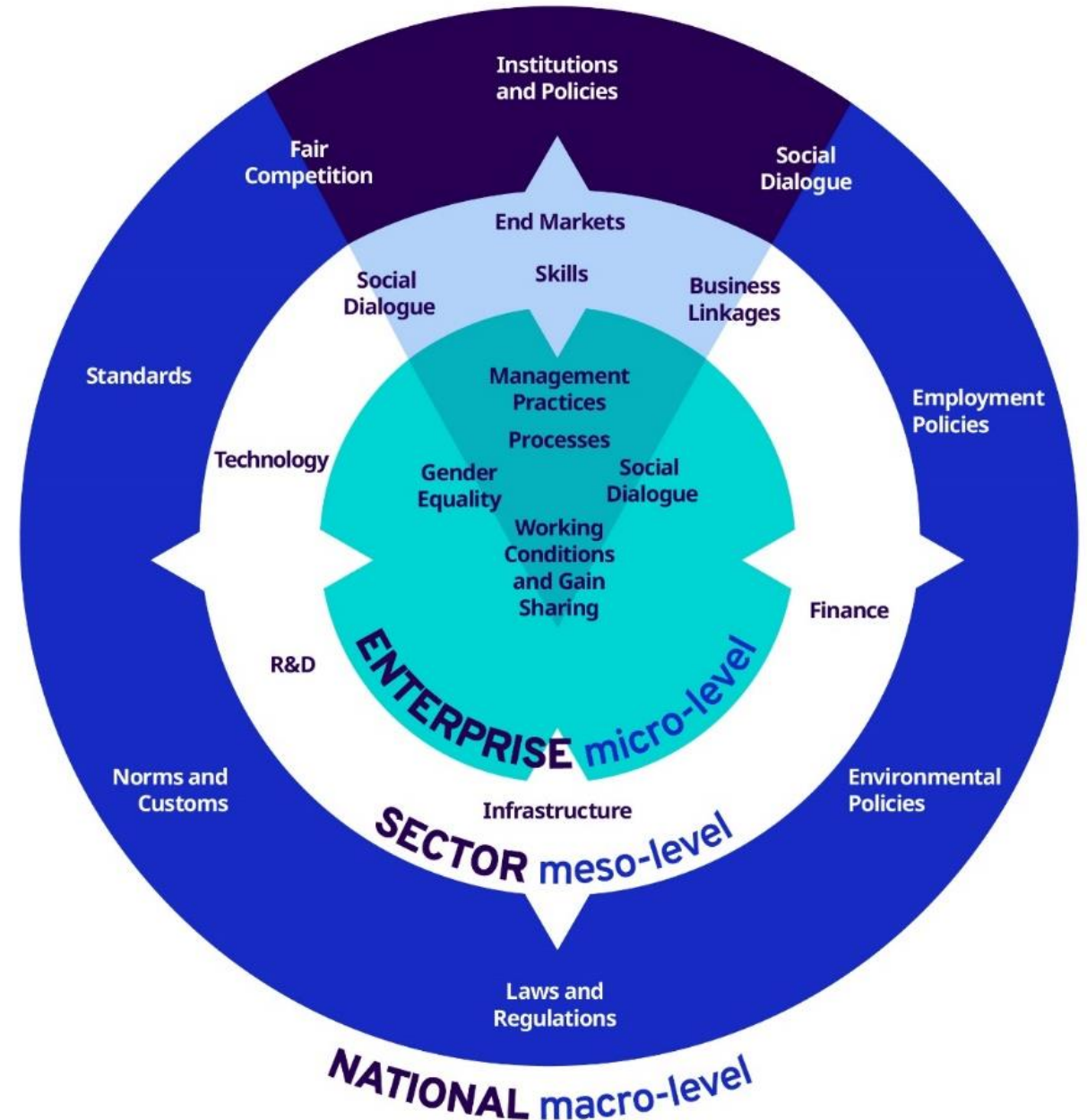

- ▶ Addresses interlinked productivity and decent work bottlenecks at enterprise, sector and national levels
- ▶ Strategy emerges through consultations and analysis → no predetermined blueprint!
- ▶ Operates in key sectors together with ILO constituents and key stakeholders



Case study: Focusing on leather and footwear and automotive sectors in South Africa

Macro:

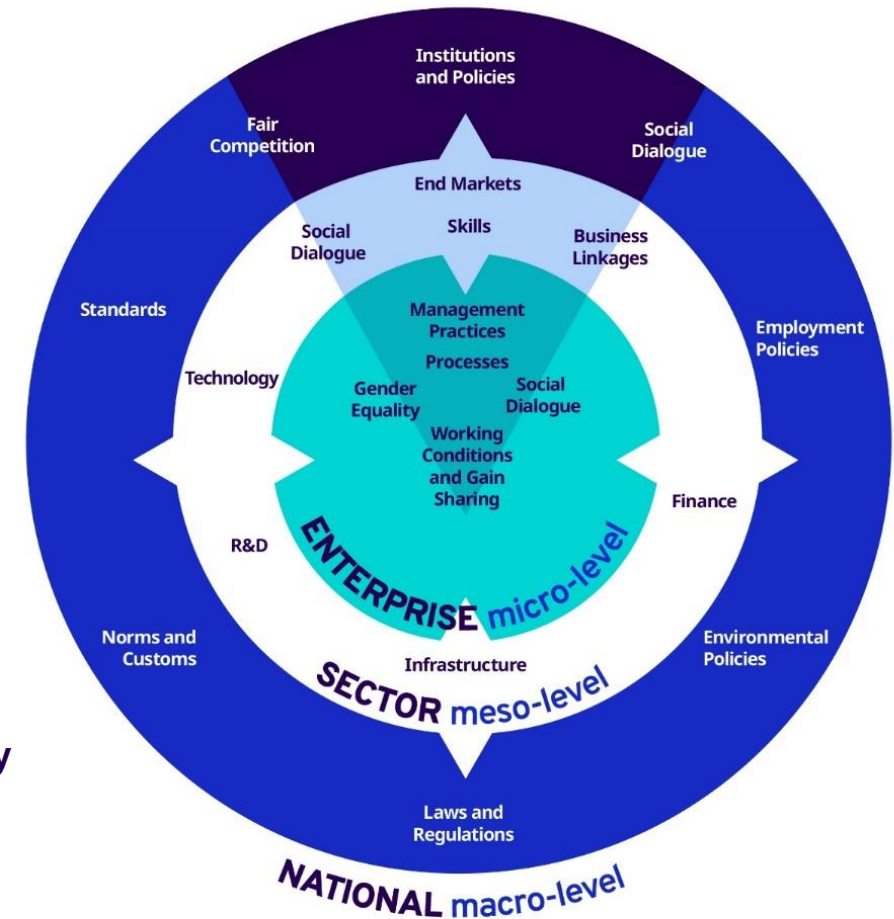
- ▶ Support new **National Employment Policy** and **Sector Master Plans**
- ▶ Enhance **productivity statistics** and their analysis
- ▶ Improve stakeholders **understanding of productivity drivers** (and linkages with decent work)

Meso:

- ▶ Analysis of **sector-specific trade policies** and their impact on the stable supply of inputs for the leather and footwear sector
- ▶ Support the development and implementation of a **cluster development strategy**
- ▶ Enhancing **export market information and market access** for SMEs

Micro:

- ▶ Up-grading skills along the value chain, particularly the cut, measure, and trim stage of the chain
- ▶ Deliver integrated theory and practical shop floor **training** to improve productivity in SMEs
