Milestones of Cooperation between Iran

and Japan (1)



The first group of training participants in the field of agriculture

- 1957; Japan's cooperation with Iran through training program started (total number until FY2018; 3,694)
- 1958; First Japanese Experts were dispatched to Iran (total number of Experts until FY2018; 1,406) (total number of Mission members until FY2018; 2,252)
- 1960; First Technical Cooperation Project started (Industrial Technology Training)
- 1974; JICA Iran Office was established (the first establishment of overseas offices in the Middle-East Region)
- 1980; JICA Iran Office temporary closed

Milestones of Cooperation between Iran and Japan (2)

1993; the first ODA loan project started (Masjid-e-Soleiman hydroelectric power plant

2005; JICA Iran Office reopened





2003; Japan Disaster Relief Team was dispatched to Iran for Bam Earthquake

Milestones of Cooperation between Iran and Japan (3)

2018; First Grant Agreements (air pollution analyzing and medical equipment) were signed







2019; First Senior Volunteer (Rasht) (Japanese Garden) was dispatched to Iran

Why ODA?

"to contribute to the peace and development of the international community, and thereby to help ensure Japan's own security and prosperity."

(Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan, ODA Charter [revised in 2003])

What is it?


"Human Security refers to the safeguarding of people's freedom from fear and want, ensuring that they can live in safety and dignity." (JICA)




