In accordance with the request from the National Water Commission/Ministry of Water for technical assistance from the Government of Japan through JICA to strengthen its capacity of water maintenance through technology transfer, Mission Teams were dispatched for Preparatory Study. Subsequently, the Record of Discussion was signed in March 2007. Signing of the R/D prepared the way for the implementation of the Project for Capacity Building of Water Maintenance.

Four (4) officers of the National Water Commission received training in Japan during FY2007 on Water Supply Management. The goal of Water Supply Management is to develop a sustainable supply system, including optimization of pressure, energy conservation and reduction of water distribution costs.

STAGE II:

The second stage of the project which commenced in January 2008 saw the following activities being implemented:

- Improvement of capacity of operation and maintenance in Pilot Water Treatment Plants
- Procurement of Equipment and materials
- Evaluation of the Existing capacity of operation and maintenance issues.
- Counterpart training of six (6) NWC officers in Japan during FY2008.
