Synopsis of Macroeconomic Situation

Robust macroeconomic situation with high economic growth rate, but challenges remain to achieve sustainable development

- Robust economic growth with more than 6% in recent years based on strong performance of export in Ready-made Garment (RMG) sector
- Achieving lower middle-income country status of the World Bank in 2015 with \$1,190 of GNI/Capita and full-filling the eligibility criteria of graduation from the Least Developed Country (LDC) status of the United Nations for the first time in 2018.

At the same time,


- Possibility of deteriorating current account balance due to growing competition in RMG sector, depletion of natural gas and decrease of remittance from overseas workers
- Possibility of growing public debt if the fiscal balance remains in deficit and the government continues to borrow

Bangladesh needs to manage macroeconomic situation more capably, including:

- Development of new industries, especially the export-oriented ones
- Tax reform and capacity enhancement of tax collection to increase revenue
- Proper debt management to keep it at sustainable level

Jica Stages of Economic Development and Ignition Point in Economic Growth

Reaching ignition point in mid-2010s with the possibility of robust growth in coming years



How Bangladesh Should Pave the Way for the Future After Reaching the Ignition Point

The key for Bangladesh to achieve sustainable economic development is if Bangladesh can direct limited resources to (1) develop most potential industries, (2) improve infrastructure and (3)nurture human resources in a balanced manner while promoting FDI & Export




JICA's Cooperation Strategy in Bangladesh


JICA's cooperation approach, focusing on both economic development and social stability under 2 pillars, 7 sectors and 9 programs

JICA's cooperation in Bangladesh is expanding since early 2010s with the scale of ODA Loan Projects and Technical Cooperation Projects increasing






(Reference 2) Breakdown of Japan's ODA Loans to Bangladesh

Recent Activities under Power, Energy and Transportation Network -Development of Moheshkhali / Matarbari Area-


Integrated Development of Moheshkhali and Matarbari area, the game changer for the future growth of Bangladesh

Background:

 With the development of Matarbari Power Plants, both the Prime Ministers agreed on the concept of Bay of Bengal Industrial Growth Belt (Big-B) in the Summit Talks in 2014 to develop a regional node and hub of value chains in Dhaka-Chittagong-Matarbari belt.

• Future Cooperation:

 Placing the Matarbari Power Plants and the Seaport as the core infrastructure, JICA considers assistance for the integrated development of the entire area with the Moheshkhali-Matarbari Integrated Infrastructure Development Initiative (MIDI), led by Prime Minister's Office(PMO).



Recent Activities under the Transportation Network -Dhaka Mass Rapid Transit Project (Line 1,5 and 6)

Changing the mode of transportation among 20 million city dwellers in Dhaka with 70km long urban railways under operation in coming years



Case. (Agriculture) BOP Business Survey for Mung Bean Cultivation (Euglena Co.Ltd)

Through the trainings to low-income farmers, Euglena has successfully produced Mung Beans and **exported them to Japan**. Currently the number of contracted farmers are around 8,000, and the production volume has reached 3,000 ton annually, bringing a lot of benefit to them.



Case. ducation IT <u>Courses of the Information Technology Engineers</u>
(KJS Co.Ltd) <u>Examinations (ITEE)</u>

Feasibility Studies are conducted through the installation of E-Learning course for ITEE at BRAC Universities and other universities. The learning tool has contributed to developing the IT human resources in Bangladesh through the increase of the number of ITEE passer.

East West Medical College and <u>Hospital Project</u>

JICA makes capital contribution to Ship Aichi Medical Service Limited, which was established jointly by East West Medical Hospital (Bangladesh) and Green Hospital Supply Inc (Japan).

This will provide international level of health services to Bangladeshi people, by utilizing **Japanese know-how** in terms of hospital management.
