What is the Fire Wardens Club (FWC)?

The Fire Wardens Club is an extra-curricular activity for students in primary schools. It is a *uniformed* club and was established by the Jamaica Fire Brigade supported and endorsed by the Ministry of Education.

What is the purpose of the (FWC)?

To empower Wardens with the right knowledge, skills and attitudes to be prepared for, respond to, and recover from disasters which can mean the difference between life and death.

RULES & CODES OF CONDUCT

Wardens must:

- Always show respect to Superintendents and obey their instructions.
- Never use offensive language or behavior towards fellow club members.
- Display good team spirit and support for fellow Wardens.
- Attend all club meetings and participate in activities when at school and complete all assignments.
- Never behave in a manner that would damage the reputation of the club either at or away from school.
- Wear uniform with pride.
- Volunteer their time to help others.

Superintendents (Teachers) must:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of each Warden.
- Support, encourage and involve all wardens regardless of their abilities.
- Ensure all activities are appropriate to the age and ability of each warden.
- Promote espirit-de-corps (team work) among wardens.
- Never condone rule violations, nor display nepotism and favouritism.
- Never use offensive language or behaviour.
- Never behave in a manner that would bring the club or the Jamaica Fire Brigade into disrepute.

<u>Sergeant</u>

- Responsible for securing all club materials and equipment
- Assists at FWC events
- Be a good FWC Role Model

<u>Corporal</u>

- Assists the Sergeant with his or her duties
- Assists at FWC events
- Be a good FWC Role Model

Note Well: A FWC Leader can be demoted for misconduct. Demotion means that he/she will be reduced to the next lower position/rank on the pyramid. For example, a Deputy Officer can be demoted to a Sergeant.

INDISCIPLINE

OFFENCES		POSSIBLE OUTCOME
1	Misconduct (e.g. fighting)	DEMOTION or;Will not be eligible for
		promotion for 1 year.
2	Using offensive language	Awarded 3 demerits
3	Wearing FWC Uniform with other forms of clothing (eg. Jeans, etc.)	Awarded 2 demerits
4	Absent from club meetings (without reason)	Awarded 1 demerit

<u>Note:</u> A maximum of six (6) demerits within a school year will result in Demotion and/or non-eligibility for promotion.

UNIFORM

The Weekly Wear (below) must be worn to each club meeting.

CLUB ACTIVITIES

All topics and activities are disaster-based and presented under 6 general subject areas:

- 1. Types of Hazards & Disasters:
 - Fire
 - Earthquake
 - Hurricane
 - Tsunami
 - Other hazards & disasters
- 2. First Aid
- 3. Rescue Techniques / Ropes & Knots
- 4. Foot Drill
- 5. Fire Brigade Knowledge
- 6. Volunteerism

> ACTIVITY AWARDS

There are five Individual Activity Awards that Wardens can achieve annually within their respective Club Squadron. The winners of these special awards will emerge out of the examinations/tests and will be awarded with a Certificate of Achievement and a special Badge/Pin. The categories are:

- 1. Best First Aider
- 2. Rescue Champion
- 3. Drill Champion
- 4. Ropes Master
- 5. QUIZ Wiz (best achievement in written test)

> MERIT PIN

If a Warden earns up to 2 merits for the following activities within a school term (September – December or January to March or April – June), he/she may be awarded a merit pin/button. One (1) merit will be awarded per action:

- Helping hands(Volunteering)
- Good Turnout (uniform inspection)

METEREOLOGIST AWARD – (Disaster Portfolio)

This award is given to the top Warden from each Squadron who documents in a journal (scrap book) or Video documentary, the significant weather activities across the world within a school year. The awardees will be recognized at the annual Promotion & Awards Banquet held in May each year.

Message to Parents

Your child/ward is a member of the Jamaica Fire Brigade's Fire Wardens Club. He/she is expected to abide by the codes and conduct of the club.

The club has an established website to which photographs depicting club activities will be uploaded periodically. If you do not wish photos of your child/ward to be uploaded to the website, you should inform the club Superintendent as soon as possible.

Do encourage your child/ward to actively participate in the club's activities and assist him/her with assignments which are related to the Fire Wardens Club.
