Travelled to Bangkok, Thailand


8 May

9-10 May

In the conference, Ms. Saimee Yuparat made an oral presentation about her work "*Impact of Bacterial Communities on the Growth of the Rootless Duckweed (Wolffia globosa) and Their Recruited Bacteria Community from Surrounding Environment*" and discussed research progress with Dr. Chart Chiemchaisri (Be-HoBiD researcher, Faculty of Engineering, Kasetsart Univ.) who chaired the conference's session of Ms. Saimee Yuparat's presentation.
