

## **Background**

The first public meeting of the Environmental Law Association was held in June 2008. The meeting was attended by 30 Lawyers, conservationists and academics who resolved to establish an independent association that aims to protect the environment and promote sustainable neutral resource management through law.

More than 100 lawyers and conservationists have participated in meetings of the association and a core of experienced professionals have committed to supporting the activities of the association.

## 1) Community and Legal Education
