Taveuni is currently identified as the prime location to find the Kulawai, as its forests have undergone minimal change compared to Viti Levu, with the majority remaining untouched.

- 2. Fiji Petrels: Although our knowledge of this elusive species is slowly increasing, the timing of the breeding cycle remains uncertain. However, the critically endangered Fiji Petrel Pseudobulweria macgillivrayi is believed to breed only on the island of Gau, Fiji, but its nesting grounds have yet to be located.
- 3. Outreach for the Nanai cicada: Nature Fiji working solely for the conservation and sustainable management of Fiji's unique natural heritage. Their mission is to enhance biodiversity and habitat conservation, endangered species protection and sustainable use of Fiji's natural resources through the promotion of collaborative conservation action, awareness raising, education, research, and biodiversity information exchange.
