



Outstanding Achievement

PCDF's Drinking Water Safety and Security Planning (DWSSP) Program follows WHO and Global WASH standards. It offers training modules to communities, focusing on risk mapping and maintenance of water systems. PCDF's WASH Strategy, recognized by UNICEF, evolved through consultations with health authorities and evaluations by Tufts University. UNICEF's monitoring visits enhance program effectiveness, leading to expansion across Fiji.

PCDF's Community-Based Disaster Risk Management (CBDRM) Program, recognised by the National Disaster Management Office, delivers disaster preparedness training. Collaborating with NDMO, PCDF revised the National Climate Smart CBDRM Training Manual, now a standard for all community DRR interventions.

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Introduction

Being a local organisation that promotes the interests of our communities, our work is grounded on community centred approaches that build on existing community knowledge, skills, and capacities.

Background

Established in 1979 in Lautoka, the organization began as Foundations of the South Pacific Fiji (FSPF), renowned for its Kana Project, aimed at enhancing nutrition in rural boarding schools from 1979 to 1997.

Since the early 1990s, our scope expanded to include initiatives addressing:

- Women's livelihoods
- Marine conservation
- Youth agricultural projects
- Coastal rehabilitation
- Community disaster training
- Reforestation and forest rehabilitation
- Civic education and good governance
- Community water/rainwater harvesting



In all these, we work in partnership with the local government stakeholders and line ministries in the CSO network, in the implementation of our programs.

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Community Development Plans (CDP) involve collaboration with key stakeholders such as I Taukei Affairs, Live and Learn Fiji Program, and PACE Climate Change Project. Our profiling template, crafted in consultation with these partners, comprises 7 chapters covering various community aspects. PACE assisted in integrating vulnerability assessments. The information gathered aids in addressing livelihood opportunities, climate change, and disaster challenges.

The CDP process engages the entire community, focusing on social groups like women's and youth groups, among others. Discussions center on community issues highlighted in the profiling

Main Activity

Through our 5 programs, PCDF has in the last 5 to 8 years has implemented:

- WASH interventions in over 15 communities and schools,
- Conducted Community based Disaster Risk Management CBDRM and climate change adaptation initiatives with over 20 communities.
- Worked with provincial and national stakeholders on the development of the integrated community/ village development plans for around 20 target communities.
- Conducted Agricultural development activities with more than 40 target sites in the highlands of Fiji.
