

Transportation and Urban Development

- Project Title: Mass Transit System Project in Bangkok (Red Line) ODA Loan (Opening Year: Nov. 2021)

- Project Information: This project aims to develop automated milking system with additional cleaning functions and high specification of cooling system for dairy farmers. This technology will improve milk quality and productivity for dairy industry in Thailand.



Industrial and Economic Development

- Project Title: Project for Smart Factory for Local SMEs Towards Thailand 4.0 Through Regional Integrated SME Promotion (RISMEP)
- Project Location: Chiang Mai, Khon Kaen, Surat Thani
- Project Information: The Project aims to promote transformation of local SMEs into smart factories by upgrading knowledge and skill of simple IoT, or digital Kaizen through RISMEP, a network platform for supporting local SMEs.

- Overview: Responding to urgent needs from industry for development of innovative and practical engineers who will lead the "Thailand 4.0" vision through "KOSEN", a unique Japanese higher education system has been introduced for the first time in Thailand.

- Scholarships for top students to study at KOSEN colleges in Japan are provided.

Volunteer

The JICA Volunteer program is a cooperation that aims to support sustainable economic growth and enhancing basic services for a better quality of life. Japanese volunteers, known as Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteer (JOCV), are sent to more than 90 countries to work closely with the local people at various local governmental organizations

Until now, JICA has dispatched over 1,000 volunteers to Thailand and currently there are volunteers under 3 priority areas: Industrial Human Resource Development, Sustainable Industrial Development of Rural Regions, and Assistance for The Socially Vulnerable. Their skills and knowledge cover various field of work such as Computer Technology, Mechanical Engineering, Japanese Language Education, Community Development, Environmental Education, Elderly Care, Welfare for the disabled, sports, etc.
