B. Summary of Master Thesis

Title of thesis : How regulations affects trade?

I have used a new time series measure and panel data from the Code of Federal Regulations USA and World Bank indicators database, respectively, to investigate the effect of regulations on trade. Time series estimates using dynamic ordinary least squares (DOLS) indicate that regulations have a statistically significant impact on reducing trade volume in the United States (Data for Pakistan was not Available). Regulations have reduced both trade volumes and trade relative to GDP. Had regulations remained the same in 1970, trade volume would be 5.9 times larger and the trade to GDP ratio would be 34% larger. I also show that regulatory quality plays an important role in trade. Panel data estimates using system GMM for 150 countries indicate that improving regulatory quality has a positive effect on increasing trade to GDP ratio / openness in a country.

Regulations reduce both trade volume and the trade to GDP ratio. Regulations affect trade in different ways. The regulatory environment determines volume of trade and openness. Regulations are important to limit unfair trade practices and to define principles for fair trade. However, public agencies tend to keep on adding regulations that, rather than reducing unfair trade practices, affect trade volume and openness negatively. Regulations have an opportunity cost of reduced trade volume and openness, which is a cause of economic growth and employment.

Conclusively, instead of increasing regulations to control for unfair trade practices, regulatory quality should be improved across countries. My findings indicate that improving the regulatory quality improves openness. In terms of regulations, an effective policy is not to add new regulations, but to improve quality and change existing regulations to a new optimum level. This can contribute to improving trade volume and openness in developed and developing countries.
