Background of Establishment

Mrs. Maria Gibbons Merep (Idid Clan, the first ranking clan of Koror) and Mrs. Dirraingeaol Ltelatk Fritz (Ikelau Clan, the second ranking clan of Koror) co-founded this organization during the beginning of the US administration with the women of Koror.

Purpose

This organization works closely with Bilung and provides support for any events hosted in Koror. They help the Mechesil Belau, Koror Government, and legislators with whatever function they host. They also support the community and the people in any way possible.

Other organizations for women already exist in Koror for the women of Koror such as Ngar Chamayong and Maiberel. In the past, the others living in Koror but were not from Koror were never informed of events and gatherings in Koror because most organizations were only for women of Koror. Therefore, Ipang Seineng ra Oreor was established to include some women from Koror but also others residing in Koror but are from the other 15 states, to cover all the women residing in Koror.

We try to assist the members and the people of Koror to have a healthier and happier lifestyle. Sometimes we donate money or food to hospitals, jails, Red Cross, Palau International Coral Reef Center, and Palau Conservation Society, supporting the idea of keeping the environment safer and people healthier.

We have in plan to build a Bai designed for Ipang Seineng to have a location where we can meet and discuss plans for the organization, but for now, we have been borrowing places such as the Constitutional Hall in Koror. Another difficulty we face is transportation. Because our organization consists of women from all around Palau, we often find ourselves needing to go to Babeldaob or other outer states for functions such as funerals. Funerals are an important tradition in our culture and we need to go and show support, but without the transportation easily available, we often fail to attend as a group.

We encourage our daughters to join and continue the tradition! Our main motto is to be happy and healthy and enjoy life, and help others achieve that.
