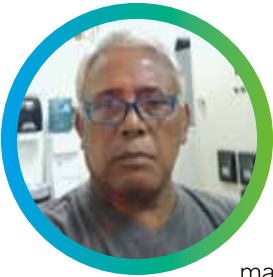
- Helping and supporting people in need

Our initial goal after leaving our respective employment was to help older women who are single and living alone with home repairs. However, we realized that this was not an isolated incident and that there are many others in the community who needed our help. We then slowly expanded to helping anyone in need.

As a long-term goal, we hope to build a sustainable concept of “Helping Hands” by keeping and maintaining data collection with efficiency, and to have the needed capacity to sustain itself to be able to help those in need in areas such as, repairing water catchment, rain gutters, roadside residential trash bins, towing away accumulated old junk cars, and other periodic maintenance to their homes. As a new entity, we need to partner up with the State Government and respective organizations in Peleliu, along with the collaboration by the grant recipient award opportunity, and assistance from JICA to accomplish our long-term vision and sustain the success of Peleliu Pride.

In addition, we would like to provide opportunities for the local fishermen to be able to have the means of earnings from their catch at the local markets. We realize the lack of a centralized model system for getting products from Peleliu to Koror thus making it much more difficult for the local producers. This is also something we wish to work on in our vision for the future, which will hopefully lead to enabling younger generations who are mostly fishermen to grow exponentially in these areas.

With my background in criminal justice and counseling and Wilhelm’s background in many areas of construction and welding, we have been doing what we can while involving and mentoring the youth of Peleliu to take part in these community support and maintenance activities. It has been very rewarding when you see a need in the community and be able to lend a helping hand whether to an individual or the State Government. The need is there and we need to be part of the solution.
