JICA has always been keen in assisting Mindanao in balancing the latter's social and economic stance amidst armed clashes. The Japanese Government launched the Japan-Bangsamoro Initiatives for Reconstruction and Development (J-BIRD) since FY 2006, in view of massive needs of reconstruction and development once final peace agreement is attained in the area.

Aside from the ARMM Social Fund, JICA's assistance for socio-economic development in the south includes the Mindanao Sustainable Settlement Area Development and the Central Mindanao Road Project. Through these projects, various kinds of infrastructure such as schools, training centers, water supply systems, and roads have been rehabilitated or constructed.

In addition to these, JICA has been conducting the Study for Socio-Economic Reconstruction and Development of the Conflict.

JICA likewise works closely with the grassroots through its Community Empowerment Program.
