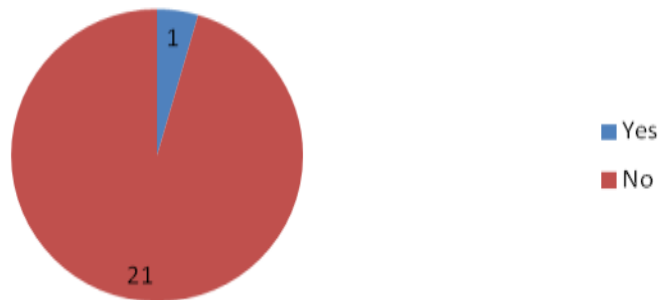

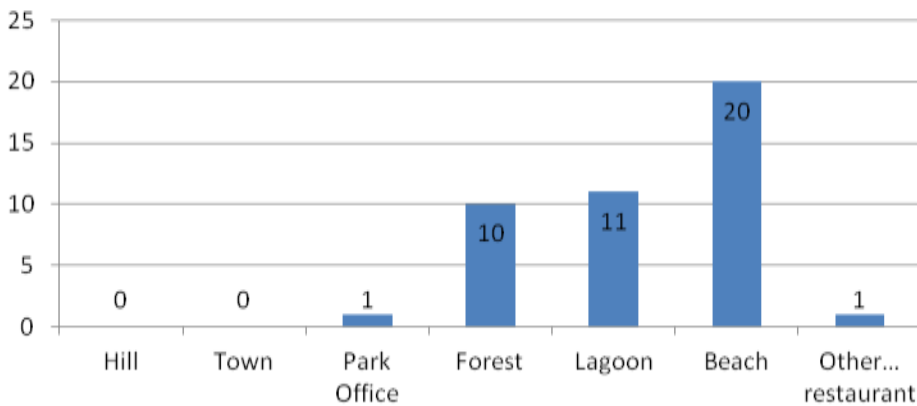
Q1: Have you ever heard about Divjake-Karavasta National Park?



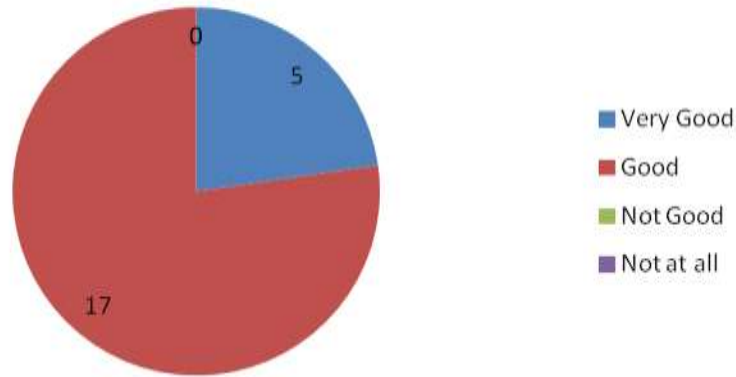
Q2: Have you ever been to this park before?



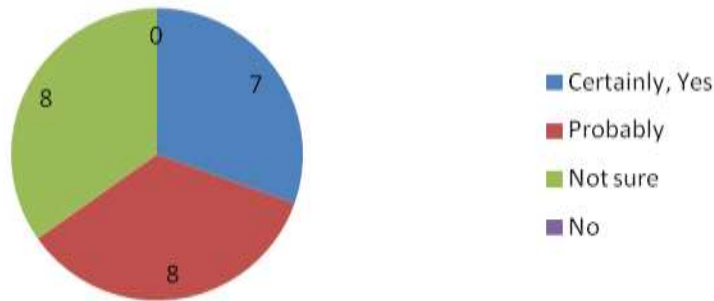
Q3: Which part of the visit you enjoyed?



Q4: How satisfied you are with the visit?



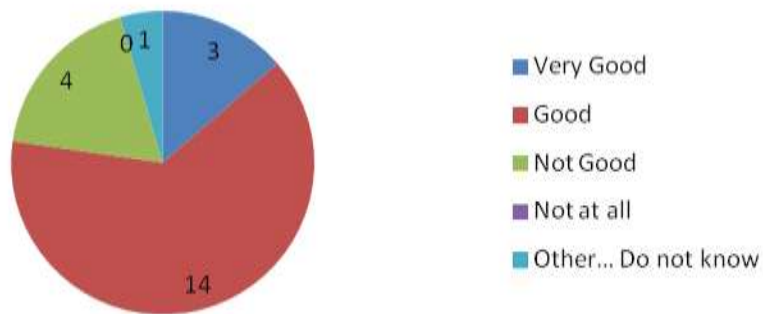
