Quality and Productivity Improvement Project in Ethiopia

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The 1st Seminar on KAIZEN in Ethiopia



Ministry of Trade and Industry (MoTI) and Japan International Cooperation Agency organized the 1st Kaizen seminar on November 4, 2009. This seminar was held as the kick-off meeting of the Quality and Productivity Improvement (Kaizen) Project which just started. The seminar was opened by opening remarks from H.E. Mr. Tadesse Haile, State Minister of MoTI, H.E. Mr. Kinichi Komano, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Japan to Ethiopia, and Mr. Go Shimada, Director of Trade, Investment and Tourism Division in Industrial Development Department of JICA. The seminar was chaired by Mr. Getahun Tadesse, head of Kaizen Unit in MoTI.

Subsequently, Professor Keijiro Otsuka of National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies (GRIPS) presented the origin of Kaizen concept, and Professor Tetsushi Sonobe of GRIPS presented examples of actual implementation of Kaizen in other countries.

Following the two presentations, Mr. Motokazu

Kanokogi, Head of the JICA consultant team presented schedule and overview of the project, including selection process and criteria of the Pilot Project. Then, the floor was opened for discussion, question and answer. There were active and intensive questions raised about details of the project and relationships between Kaizen and other quality or productivity maintenance or improvement methods, such as International Standard Organization (ISO) or Business Process Re-engineering (BRP). At the end of the seminar, Mr. Getahun Tadesse, Head of Kaizen Unit in MoTI gave closing remarks.

This event was attended by senior government officials, members of related organizations, members of donors and many owners and managers of about 140 manufacturing companies.



30 companies have been selected for the Pilot Project in Kaizen Project

Kaizen Project Team, comprised of JICA Kaizen Study Team and Kaizen Unit in MoTI, have chosen 30 companies to be included in the Pilot Project and signed Service Agreement with the selected companies on December 18, 2009. The Pilot Project is a component of Kaizen Project and the selected companies will receive consultation and guidance on Kaizen methods for productivity and quality improvement for four to five months each. Achievements attained in this process will later on scaled up through the National Plan for quality and productivity improvement to encompass other manufacturing industries.

In selection of the 30 companies, MoTI and JICA formulated selection criteria as below and chose 63 candidate companies accordingly. Teams of Japanese consultants and Kaizen Unit members visited the 63 companies for quick company diagnosis for Pilot Project. Based on the results, 30 companies have finally been chosen.
