Step.2: The schedule should be submitted to the Zone focal person as well as the project regional technical advisor.




Step.3: Revise the action plan based on the farmers' **cropping calendar** and their **Action Plan**.


Step.4: DAs need to submit the activity report together with the receipt; otherwise, transportation fee and communication fee will not be paid.

Make Action plan based on the Cropping Calendar




