AYII Field Survey Report - Toward Better Insurance Products

The Project conducted an interview survey to find out how local farmers accepted the Area Yield Index Insurance (AYII), following the start of AYII pilot activity in Karawang District, West Java Province in June 2021. The Project interviewed 46 farmers who purchased AYII and 13 agricultural extension workers. According to the results of the survey, there is a strong demand to organize socialization activities (on-site briefings) for farmers to increase their understandings on AYII especially the loss assessment method, to accelerate the registration. In addition, many respondents felt that the current amount of insurance coverage is inadequate, and they wish to increase the coverage, even if it means a slightly higher premium. The Project will consider the results of this survey when reviewing the AYII design.

AYII started in Central Java

Following the trial in Karawang District in West Java Province, the AYII trial has started in Kendal District in Central Java Province. Socialization activity was held in Pageruyung Sub-District in Kendal District on 8 June. In July, a training session was organized to explain how to conduct CCE (Crop Cutting Experiments), followed by the start of the actual CCE.

Report on the AOTP-TOT Survey

AOTP (Indemnity based agricultural insurance for paddy) - TOT (Training of Trainers) was conducted three times in South Sulawesi and East Java Provinces since 2020. A follow-up survey was conducted in each region, and reporting session was held on 19 July. The former trainees, mainly agricultural extension workers, answered that the trainings enabled them to deepen understandings on AOTP, especially loss assessment and the claims application process, although it has not yet directly reflected in an increase in insurance subscribers. Challenges included the personnel transfer of extension officers, farmers' disinterest, and lack of dissemination of the Apps such as SIAP and PROTAN. The Ministry of Agriculture is currently studying the training program to integrated it into its regular training programs.
