The first Joint Coordinating Committee (JCC) meeting (October 25, 2012)



The first Joint Coordinating Committee (JCC) meeting was held on October 25, 2012 at the KEMRI Boardroom, Nairobi.

JCC is a decision-making forum that is composed of representatives from the Ministry of Health, Kenya Medical Research Institute (KEMRI), JICA Kenya office and JICA experts. The aim of this meeting is to share the progress and timelines of each activity, to discuss any challenges, and to modify plans as necessary.

Ms. Sakai, Senior Project Coordinator at Japan Science and Technology Agency (JST), participated as an observer.

In the JCC, there were presentations, where progress on each activity was shared according to the Project Design Matrix (PDM) and the Plan of Operation (PO). The participants confirmed that all planned activities were proceeding/continuing as scheduled.
