In SHEP UP (previous phase of SHEP PLUS), water-harvesting & storage technology was demonstrated to this group. That empowered them, and they constructed water ponds on their own, using own resources and efforts. Let's hear their story!

After conducting market survey, we realized peak demand season is at a time we have no produce due to inadequate water supply. After we went through water harvesting training conducted by SHEP UP, we decided to construct water ponds in order to irrigate our crops. We mobilized our own resources and by 2015 we made 16 water pans in our group.

We are focused on producing the preferred varieties at the time the market demands are highest.
