
Progress of Type 3 activities in Huaykhing village cluster, Phonxay district

So far, the procurement of materials and equipment for Type 3 activities (village infrastructure development) for 4 target villages (Sakuan, Huayha, Huaytho and Phakbong villages) in Huaykhing cluster had been 100% completed. Materials and equipment requested by the villages are mainly materials for renovating village meeting hall and furniture that can be summarized as follows:

- Sakuan table, chair, filing cabinet, totaling 3,400,000 Kips
- Huayha materials for building meeting hall, totaling 13,350,000 Kips
- ➤ Huaytho materials for concrete flooring, totaling 10,580,000 Kips
- Phakbong roofing sheet/nails for renovating meeting hall, totaling 4,685,000 Kips

Total amount supported by PAREDD for Type 3 activities for 4 villages is 32,015,000



Importance of Forest Patrol by LFMC



Land and Forest Management Committee (LFMC) in 4 villages under PAREDD project in XGN district have conducted 2nd forest patrol on 2nd week of March.

This is quarterly program for patrolling land and forest use according to zoning and its' regulation made by PAREDD Approach each village. It was timely conducted because of upcoming preparation of up-land rice cultivation.

4 villages LFMC confirmed that their zoning and regulation are respected by residents but few remarks were found such as overhunting NTFP (Non-Timber Forest Products) in village conservation area.

Results of patrolling were shared each other at LFMC Exchange meeting among 4 villages and DAFO will take initiative in order to deal above remarks.

Next forest patrol would be conducted in June.
