IMPORTANCE OF THE NHIP (IN CAR)

- Provides a venue for LGUs to provide social insurance coverage to the people
- Gives an opportunity for people's organization (cooperatives, farmers and women's groups, etc.) to expand their services to other ventures
- Provides an opportunity to big-hearted individuals to share their blessings by enrolling the less fortunate and economically challenged members of the community to PhilHealth



- Provides a challenge to health care providers to improve their skills and facilities
- Provides an opportunity for collaboration and cooperation between and among agencies
- Provides a chance for the government and private sectors not only to forge new partnerships but also to renew and strengthen existing ones
- Provides additional source of funds for health and health – related programs and activities of the LGUs

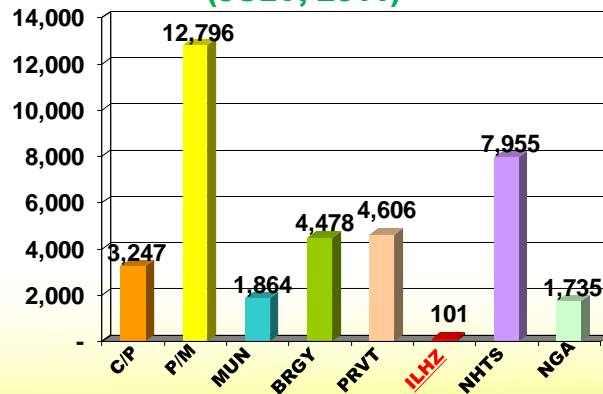

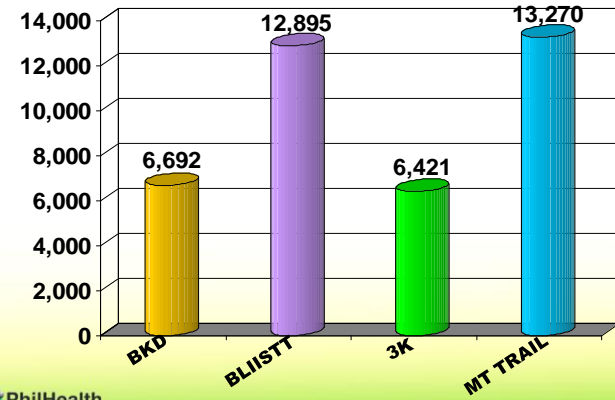

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SPONSORED PROGRAM ENROLLMENT (JULY, 2011)

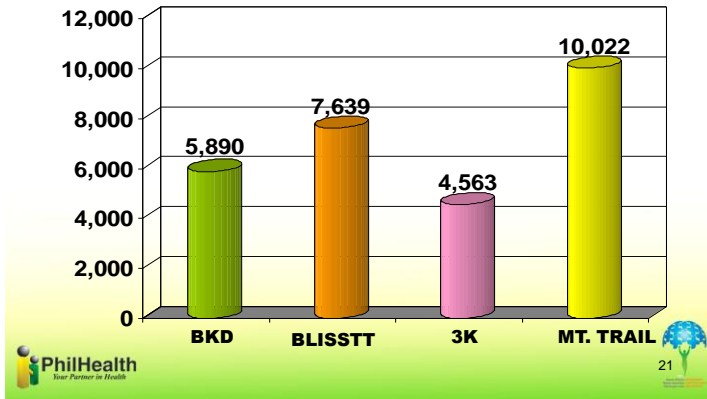


SP ENROLLMENT PER ILHZ AS OF DECEMBER, 2011



SP ENROLLMENT PER ILHZ

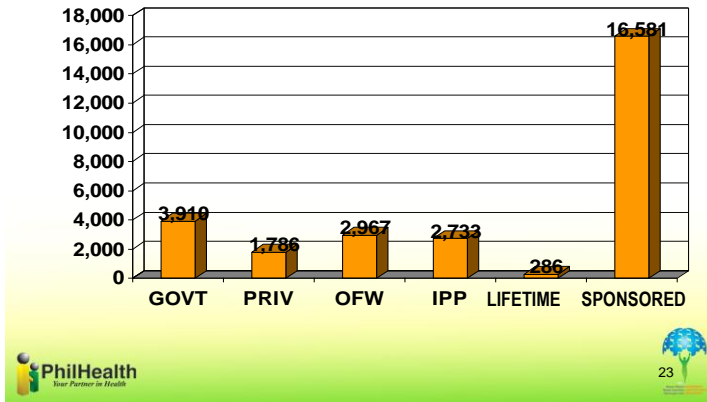
AS OF MAY, 2012



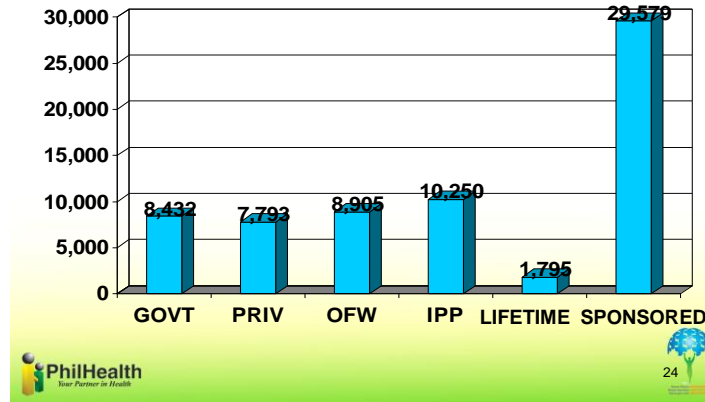
STATUS OF SP ENROLLMENT IN CAR (AS OF MAY 31, 2012)

PCF UTILIZATION BY THE LGUs

- REPAIR OF RHUs
- PURCHASE OF DRUGS and MEDICINES
- CAPABILITY TRAININGS
- PURCHASE OF EQUIPMENT AND OFFICE SUPPLIES FOR RHUs

PROGRAMS/ACTIVITIES INITIATED BY THE ILHZs IN SUPPORT TO PHILHEALTH

- 3K ILHZ enrolled 101 families under the Sponsored Program
- Integration of the Sponsored Program to their plans and budget (CHTF)
- The conduct of a health summit where PhilHealth was invited to give an orientation on the NHIP

- BLIISTT ILHZ forwarded a resolution to the office of Congressman Cosalan for the renewal of the Congressional/Provincial sponsorship
- **LCES and Barangay Officials actively participate in the conduct of IECs**
- Crafting of a resolution requesting the MLGUs to require business owners to enroll their employees to PhilHealth as part of the issuance and renewal of their business permits

- Encouragement of the owners of small businesses to enroll as Individually Paying Program (IPM) members
- **Allocation of funds to aide the indigent families in the payment of their hospital bills**
- Sharing of manpower and facilities to fast track PhilHealth accreditation

DOs OF THE SPONSORED PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION

- **Intensive orientation on the NHIP (Mobilize and strengthen the community)**
- **Active support of the LGUs**
- **Preparation and submission of reports required by PhilHealth**
- **Timely payment of premiums**
- **Increase enrolment**
- **Accreditation of health care providers (both personnel and facility)**
