espite the Covid-19 vaccination being on the list of mitigation programmes since April 2021, vaccination eligible coverage for population bv September, 2021 in Zambia was 4.9%. The Minisry of Health on 7th October held a Covid-19 vaccination re-launch campaign event with the intention to scale-up the number of people that were getting vaccinated by the end of 2021 to 70% of the eligible population. This would be made possible with the implementation of various initiatives that will be implemented by the ministry. The project participated at the Re-launch event by show of a photo-display of what the activities of the project had been thus far. The control

of infectious diseases is top of the Project's agenda and Covid-19 included. Since it's launch the project has implemented measures that increase capacity of the hospitals to be able to efficiently manage and avoid the spread of the virus.

The Project Coordinator Mr Takashi Hara highlighted to the President the donations of hospital equipment as well as the goals of the project going forward. The President Mr Hakainde Hichilema who was the guest of honour at the event, visited the projects stand and he said that he was very aware of the support that the Japanese government has been giving to Zambia through the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA).

Speaking to the project team and Mr Hara, he thanked the Japanese governement on behalf of the Zambian people and commended the project on the works done thus far in enhancing the health sector and other developmental projects that have been implemented.

## JICA'S PROJECT DONATES 5 TENTS FOR COVID-19 SCREENING/TESTING TENTS TO CHAWAMA GENERAL HOSPITAL

The COVID-19 testing site at Chawama Hospital was chronically crowded, close to the waiting rooms for non-COVID-19 outpatients including diabetes patients. Furthermore, at testing site patients with symptoms such as cough and fever and patients who were asymptomatic or just worried about COVID-19 were waiting together without social distancing. Therefore, after discussions with staff, our project provided five tents to clearly distinguish between non-COVID-19 patients, symptomatic and asymptomatic COVID-19 patients. The green tent is for asymptomatic clients, the orange tent is for symptomatic patients, and the yellow tent is for confirmed COVID-19 patients. Dr. Chanda, Medical superintendent of Chawama General Hospital, thanked Project for helping manage patient flow and providing timely support to the facility. Now Chawama Hospital is preparing for the fourth wave.
