BACKGROUND OF THE PROJECT

The decline of forest in both area and quality is most evident in the central highland, and is gradually spreading to the south-western part where relatively dense forests are still remaining. Currently, Oromia Region represents approximately 70% of the forest resources of the country, its closed high forests are diminishing due to shifting cultivation, fuel wood collection, urbanization, forest fires, poor utilization logging. Unless effective measures are taken, the forest resources would disappear in a few decades.

In this context, the Oromia Regional Government in Ethiopia requested to the Government of Japan for technical cooperation on the Project. The first phase of Belete-Gera PFMP initiated in october 2003 as a three-year project, mainly focusing on establishment of forest management system to be carried out by local people.

In June 2006, the joint terminal evaluation concluded the project purpose is mostly achieved since a system of PFM is mostly established in which Provisional-Forest Management Agreement were signed between WaBuBs, local peoples' forest management associations, in the target sub-villages and the Oromia Regional Government.

In order to support existing WaBuBs on their capacity to implement PFM and further expand WaBuB PFM in Belete-Gera RFPA, JICA and Oromia Regional Government has agreed to support the 2nd phase of Belete-Gera PFMP, which commenced on October 1, 2006.
