Project title	Project on Capacity Improvement of Recovery and Reintegration Assistance for Trafficked Persons in Myanmar
Project duration	29 June 2012 – 28 June 2015 (3 years)

Project outline	In the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, which has national borders with five countries, the number of identified trafficked persons is on an increase due to the widening economic and social disparity between its neighbouring countries. Government of Myanmar provides protection for trafficked persons through provision of temporary shelters and Department of Social Welfare together with relevant agencies such as the Police and NGOs provides assistance for each step of repatriation process (from the return, victim identification, shelter services, family tracing, social reintegration). This Project aims for the capacity development of concerned agencies providing assistance to trafficked persons, through the provision of training and workshops, development of guidelines and training curriculum and so on. In addition, a resource room will be set up for the use of victim support agencies. This room will be equipped with information on human trafficking and will be a space for relevant agencies to network and share information.
Project purpose	Protection support and services for trafficked persons by victim support agencies in the target areas are improved.
Expected project outcomes	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The capacity of social welfare staff and social workers of victim support agencies to protect trafficked persons is enhanced. 2. Pilot activities for protection of trafficked persons are planned and implemented. 3. Practical tool and information on protection of trafficked persons are developed and shared among victim support agencies.

Workshops by trained trainers (multiplier courses) Target group: Regional staff of DSW, police and other related agencies, NGO (watch group members), business owners or managers, media
