CM4TIP at a glance

CM4TIP (Case Management for Trafficking in Person) Project is a joint cooperation project between Royal Thai Government and Japanese Government to combat human trafficking in Mekong sub-region.

Thailand declared its national policy, "ZERO Tolerance to Human Trafficking" in 2015. Thailand's efforts to combat human trafficking are critical to the betterment of overall human security and human rights situation in the region as Thailand is a key destination, transit and origin country of human trafficking in the region. While 96.7% (2016) of identified foreign victims of trafficking in Thailand are from Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar and Vietnam, it is imperative for Thailand to strengthen partnerships with neighboring countries to take joint actions against human trafficking, to build national capacity to protect victims, and to assist their safe return and successful social reintegration.



Capacity Building of MDT for Improved Assistance for Victims of Trafficking (VOT)

CM4TIP Project strives to build capacity of MDT members especially social workers/ case managers in Thailand and at the border areas to the neighboring countries.

Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT)



MDT is a group of professionals with specialized knowledge, skills and experience who work together to solve problems in a systematic manner. MDT usually involves government officials and agencies such as social workers, police, prosecutors, doctors, lawyers, labor protection officers and NGOs. MDT approach is a key concept in Thailand based on the common understanding that one single organization cannot efficiently

provide comprehensive assistance to victims of trafficking, thus multi-disciplinary team members are expected to work together in unison. DATIP plays the secretariat role of MDT. CM4TIP Project assists;

- Capacity building of MDT members especially case managers/ social workers for improved assistance delivery for VOT's safe repatriation and social reintegration
- Development of the Repatriation and Reintegration handbook to streamline the process and roles of actors in order to realize smooth repatriation and assistance for social reintegration
- Capacity development of MDTs at border areas in Bokeo - Chiang Rai, Champasak – Ubon Ratchathani, and Tachilek – Chiang Rai focusing on VOT's repatriation and social reintegration.

Promotion of Victim - Centered Approach

CM4TIP Project promotes the Thai government's Victim - Centered Approach (VCA) where the VOT's rights are ensured and their needs are respected.

- Capacity building of VOT peer support group(s).
- Delivery of VOT's voice to MDT via annual MDT VOT forum.
- Provision of VCA training to MDT members especially shelter staff and case managers.
