






































National Unity Day

An annual national sports competition held since 2016, for "Peace and Social Cohesion" in South Sudan.








this first-ever attempt was organized with the cooperation of JICA (Japan International Cooperation Agency)

This led to the idea of National Unity Day,

























For the people of South Sudan, the most popular sport is soccer.


Let me explain again a little about how National Unity Day (NUD) came to be.

the country was gifted around 2,000 soccer balls (simple rubber balls) by UNICEF In 2015, before the start of NUD, when there was much poverty in South Sudan,







the housing for the athletes and the competition grounds were rapidly completed




