JOCV activities in Solomon Islands

The exchange of note between the Government of Solomon Islands and the Government of Japan was signed on the Independence Day of 7th July, 1978.

The first two (2) volunteers were dispatched to Solomon Islands on 19th June, 1979. They were assigned to work with the Auki Fisheries Center in Malaita Province.

Since its inception the Government of Japan has dispatched more than 400 volunteers in various technical fields up to now. Currently, 34 JICA volunteers (19 males and 15 females as of Nov. 2017) are working in 6 provinces.

JICA volunteers continue to work in Solomon Islands with the motto "Live tugeda Waka tugeda Fo Bildim Gudfala Future".
