
What is JICA?

Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) is the executing agency of Japanese ODA which assists developing countries to resolve various issues. Funds that are used in Japanese ODA are supported by the taxes paid by Japanese people.

JICA is currently **the world's largest bilateral aid agency** working in over 150 countries and regions and having nearly 100 overseas offices.



Disaster Relief

In cases of the occurrence of a large-scale disaster overseas, JICA dispatches Japan Disaster Relief Teams and / or provides emergency supplies.

Technical Cooperation

Technical Cooperation involves dispatching of experts, provision of necessary equipment and training personnel from developing countries in Japan and other countries.

ODA Loans

ODA Loans support developing countries by providing Lowinterest, long-term concessional loans to finance their development efforts. ODA loans, which require repayment, underpin developing countries' **ownership** in the process.

Grand Aid

Grant Aid is the provision of funds to developing countries which have low income levels, without the obligation of repayment. Grant aid is used for improving basic infrastructure such as schools, hospitals, water-supply facilities and roads.

Cooperation through Citizen Participation

JOCV/SV Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers/Senior Volunteers Volunteer programs support activities by citizens who wish to cooperate in the economic and social development as well as the reconstruction of developing countries.

JICA Partnership Program (JPP)

JPP is a technical cooperation program to contribute to the social and economic development of developing countries at the grass-roots level in collaboration with "Partners in Japan" including NGOs.

History of JICA's Cooperation in Solomon Islands

JICA's assistance to Solomon Islands started in 1978. The first cooperation were two Grand Aid Projects as well as dispatching of JOCVs in Auki Fisheries. Since then, JICA extended its assistance in the sum of over 39 billion Japanese Yen.

The first two JOCVs were dispatched to Solomon Islands in June, 1979 assigned at the Auki Fisheries Center in Malaita Province. Since its inception, JICA has dispatched more than 400 volunteers in various technical fields up to now.



Infrastructure

The Project for Upgrading of Kukum Highway

JICA supports improvements of existing bridges and roads as well as drainage ditches along the Kukum Highway, and also makes safety and convenience improvements to alleviate traffic congestion, boosting safety, and to reconstruction, disaster risk

reduction and logistics improvements.



Training in Japan

JICA invites personnel from developing countries in Japan for trainings to transfer Japan's technology, skills and knowledge Since 1978, Over 740 Solomon Islands governmental officials, officers from private and NGOs have been trained. An association of Ex-JICA Training Participants named Solomon-Nihon (JICA) Alumni Association was established in June 1995.

JICA SI also dispatched the total of 10 Solomon Islands government officers to study at Masters' courses in Japan.



Total Number (411) of Volunteers to Solomon Islands (as of Aug 2017)


