FROM THE DESK OF COUNTRY DIRECTOR

Dear readers, welcome to this 14th Issue of the bi-monthly newsflash from Tanzania Country Office. It covers activities that were carried out at the country office in the months of March and April 2010. Topics covered include NERICA Varieties release in Zanzibar, Community Empowerment Programme at AICAD's Model Area of Kibaha and other topics. Please read on!

1. RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT (R&D)

1.1. <u>New Rice for Africa (NERICA)</u>: Launching of Varieties in Zanzibar Marked the end of AICAD's Support for NERICA

The task of the NERICA Seed Registration Committee came to a conclusion with the successful registration of three NERICA varieties in March 2010. A ceremony to mark registration and release of the NERICA seeds (**NERICA No.1, No. 10 and No. 12**) to farmers in Zanzibar and Pemba was held on the 5th March 2010. Incidentally, this also marked the end of AlCAD's intervention for NERICA in Zanzibar & Pemba.

Post-registration activities of Seed-Multiplication and Extension (Dissemination) will be taken over by TANRICE Project from Tanzania Mainland.

The ceremony was officiated by the Zanzibar Minister of Agriculture, Livestock and Environment. The Assistant Country Director, Mr. Ayub A. Matumbo delivered a keynote speech at the ceremony on behalf of AICAD.

1.2. KTDP: Low Cost Housing Technology Dissemination

Dr. Makunza of UDSM and Mr. Tweve of NHBRA met and held talks on a joint proposal for conducting a workshop and a demo for Dissemination of LCH technology. Further discussions and preparations are on-going.

2. COUNTRY PROGRAMME REVIEW (CPR): Working with Consultants to Complete the Exercise

After making field visits to various sites in Tanzania, the consultants from Innovative Enterprise Support Company (IESCO) Limited of Kenya produced a draft report on Tanzania CPR. At a meeting held at TCO on 22nd March 2010, the CPR draft report was presented and reviewed for improvement. The final report was further presented to AICAD Headquarters alongside with CPR reports from Kenya and Uganda Country Offices for further deliberations by the AICAD Secretariat. A final CPR Report was expected to be produced and submitted by the end of April 2010.

3. COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMME (CEP)

3.1. CEP Survey for Data Collection from 27th - 30th April 2010

AICAD TCO undertook a field survey at Kibaha District to collected data from five women groups which were already selected for CEP. The groups visited were Hekima, Tumaini, Jitegemee, Proper Food for Health and Kweda Women group. In general the groups were characterized by low income due to small volumes of production which were inadequate for the available market of agroprocessed products.

3.2. Community Empowerment Programme (CEP) Expert Visit

A short-term CEP expert from JICA Headquarters in Tokyo-Japan, Mr. Satoshi Chikami, visited AICAD TCO from 11th -20th April 2010. During this time, Mr. Chikami and Mr. Yamamoto from JICA-Tanzania, witnessed the CEP participatory planning with twelve Kibaha Women groups. Mr. Chikami's expertise was a valuable resource for guiding AICAD TCO staff in the exercise.

3.3. CEP Participatory Planning Workshop at Kibaha Mlandizi

AICAD TCO is now implementing community empowerment programme for women groups engaged in food processing and value addition in Kibaha district. The CEP centres focus on capacity development through training, however it also includes some other activities such as modeling of good practitioners through input assistance and min-research on technology development and /or product marketing. It also takes the bottom-up approach to the targeted community through participatory planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation. The one day CEP workshop aims at identifying opportunities and problems facing women groups engaged in food processing and Value addition. Although food processing and value addition is set as an entry point to the targeted community, CEP shall address community issues as much as possible within its implementation capacity. During this participatory planning workshop, twelve women groups (with more than 80 members) were met and PCM techniques/approach was used to carry out problem analysis (Causes-effects).

3.4. Courtesy Call to District Executive Director (DED) Town Council- Kibaha district

On 20th April 2010, AICAD TCO officers together with CEP expert and AICAD TCO Advisor, visited Kibaha town council to meet and share with the DED some of problems identified during the participatory planning workshops. The workshops had divided the problems into three categories, namely, problems that can be intervened by the local government, problems that can be handled by participants themselves and those to be assisted by AICAD TCO. On the part of the local government, the DED agreed to collaborate with AICAD TCO and she instructed the town council community development Officer to take seriously the problems of the women groups.

The team also visited the District Commissioner's office on the same day. The team met District Administrative Secretary (Acting DC), and shared with her the same problems of the women groups. The major problem of the women groups was to get a communal building were they could install simple processing machines to be accessed by whole group members. The DAS was very pleased with these developments and promised to refer the issues to the regional level for awareness and for more assistance.
