2. TRAINING & EXTENSION

2.1 Report of the Monitoring and Evaluation for ICT2-VA

The leader of the team for evaluating the 2nd in country training course on value addition (ICT2-VA) submitted the first draft report on 2nd November 2008 for review and final approval. The report was later finalised and approved for submission to the headquarters. The monitoring and evaluation exercise took place between September – October and involved field interviews with trainees in Mvomero, Morogoro Rural, Mogororo Urban and Kibaha districts.

2.2 Implementation of the ICT6-IWRM

The Sixth In-country Training Course on Irrigation and Water Resources Management (ICT6-IWRM) was implemented in accordance with the plans outlined in the 5th issue. The course was held at the Institute of Continuing Education (ICE) of the Sokoine University of Agriculture (SUA) in Morogoro from 10th-28th November 2008; targeting small holder farmers from Kwala, Dutumi and Mwembengozi villages of Kwala Ward of Kibaha District Council. Generally the course aimed at imparting knowledge and skills to farmers for improving productivity through irrigation farming, adopting irrigation technologies and management of the related resources. The course was officially opened by **Prof. Joseph Kuzilwa**, the Vice Chancellor of Mzumbe University and closed by **Eng. Method Ishengoma**, the Eastern Zonal Irrigation Engineer who also offered certificates to successful graduates.

Majority of the facilitators were from departments of Agricultural Engineering, Crop Science, Food Science & Technology, Agricultural Economics & Agribusiness, Soil Science, and Agricultural Education & Extension SUA. Others came from Morogoro Municipal Council Department of Agriculture and Livestock Development, Cholima Agro-Scientific Research Institute and Mkindo Farmer Training Centre. The course involved brief class sessions and field practices, covering modules on Principles & Methods of Irrigation for small-scale farmers, Rain Water Harvesting & Storage Techniques, Effects of Irrigation on Soil and Environment, Crops Production Methods (Production and Management of Field and Horticultural Crops), Pesticides Management and Application, Extension Methods and HIV/AIDS in Farming Communities. Other aspects included Organization and Management of Water Users Organizations and Self-help Groups, Study Tour on Farmer Field School to Mkindo Farmers Training Centre, Irrigated Agriculture as Business, Marketing Strategies for Agricultural products, Farm Records Keeping and Action Planning.

3.1 AICAD Executive Director Visits the Country Office

On 7th November 2008, the Executive Director for AlCAD **Prof. Andrew Gidamis** visited the Country office and held a day meeting with country office staffs. In his remarks, Prof Kuzilwa noted the need for AlCAD to explore the experiences of other institutions that have succeeded in funding researches and learn better modalities for supporting this function. He encouraged AlCAD to spend more time with grass root communities for deeper understanding of needs and expectations before designing the research interventions.
