# 2.1 NERICA Long Rain Adaptability Trials in Good Progress in Zanzibar

The contract for the final NERICA Long Rain Adaptability Trials was signed in Dar es Salaam on 8th May 2009 between the principal researcher, Mr. Khatib Juma Khatib and the TCO Advisor, Dr. Masahiko Murakami.

TCO Assistant Country Director Mr. Ayub A. Matumbo, together with two AICAD/JICA Project Advisors, Dr. Jiro Nozaka from AICAD Headquarters-Nairobi and Dr. Masahiko Murakami from TCO Morogoro, visited Zanzibar on 28th May 2009. The aim of their mission was to inspect progress of the on-going NERICA Adaptability Trials and to pave the way for NERICA Registration and Variety Release that was intended to take place towards the end of this year. This delegation held fruitful discussions with collaborating institutions and stake holders in Zanzibar, particularly, the Commissioner for Agriculture Research and Extension, Mr. Mbirk Said, the Director of Policy & Planning in the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Environment, Dr. Islam S. Salum, the Head of Kizimbani Agricultural Research Station who is also the Chairman of National Seed Registration Committee, Mr. Haji Hamid. ## 2.2 Addendum to Low Cost Housing (KTDP) Brochure

On 8th May 2009, AICAD officers met the Researchers at the Faculty of Engineering of the University of Dar es Salaam to discussion dissemination of Low Cost Housing Technology.

It was agreed that researchers would update the brochure by adding information about formulae for mixing soil, cement and water for different types of soils. Any construction site could then use local soil for making interlocking brick, hence reduce costs.

The brochures are currently being distributed to interested Individuals, Builders Groups, Contractors, Small Industry Development Organisation (SIDO) and Vocational Education Training Authority (VETA) Technical Schools.

### 3. INTERACTION WITH OTHER ORGRANIZATIONS

## 3.1 Visit at Kibaha Kibaha District

AICAD TCO is currently in the preparation phase for implementation of Seventh In-Country Training Course in Irrigation and Water Resource Management (ICT7 – IWRM) and the First In-Country Training in Export Trade of Commercial Crafts (ICT1 – ET). In so doing, AICAD TCO has collaborated with other organisations in the district; particularly District Irrigation & Agricultural Officers and SIDO Officers in the identification of villages with big numbers of potential candidates for both ICT1-ET and I&WRM. The identified villages will be visited at later dates to meet those potential candidates and for their selection.

AICAD TCO participates in each year's farmer's exhibition in Morogoro known as Nanenane. On 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2009 AICAD Officers visited active Women groups who were ICT3-VA ex-trainees. Success stories were picked from Upendo and Umoja groups of Kibaha Mlandizi and were invited to participate at Nanenane from 1<sup>st</sup> August to 8<sup>th</sup> August 2009 and display their products produced as a result of AICAD training.

# 3.2 Visit at SIDO Morogoro

On 16 June 2009, the AICAD Country Office Advisor and Programme Officer visited SIDO Morogoro to share with them ideas about Community Empowerment Programme (CEP). Since SIDO had lots of experiences on the grass root level, by interacting with them, AICAD hops to gain such information as may lead to successful identification of sites and NGO's that AICAD can collaborate with in the implementation of CEP activities.

SIDO Morogoro is now collecting data to implement their own program of ODOP (One District One Project) in Morogoro Rural district and they will provide AICAD TCO with a copy of the report. The report will help AICAD TCO to make a rational decision on site selection after getting the same information from Kibaha district.

During the same visit, AlCAD TCO collected some information about an organization dealing with renewable energy, namely, Tanzanian Traditional Energy Development Organization (TaTEDO). This NGO is dealing with renewable energy of various kinds ranging from charcoal to solar power.

# Country Programme Review (CPR) Mini-Workshop at HQs
