As you may know, JICA is now marking 55 years in Tanzania. and Japanese government through the ODA system.

Tanzania is currently the top recipient of Japan's Official Development Assistance (ODA) among Sub-Saharan countries. JICA has also managed to send about 18,000 Tanzanians to Japan through Knowledge Co-Creation Program, dispatched to Tanzania about 2,000 Japanese experts in various fields and also 1,600 Japanese volunteers were dispatched to Tanzania.

The most recent achievement done by JICA is the construction of Mfugale Flyover in which was officially inaugurated by his Excellency, President John Pombe Magufuli. Sending to Japan the participants for Master's Degree and Internship Programme of African Business Education for Initiative for youth (ABE Initiative) in which as of now 85 Tanzanian youth have been sent to Japan to attend this program.

Apart from the above mentioned activities, JICA has organized its second year Ladies First Marathon in which many young ladies athletes had an opportunity to participate. Those are drawn from different regions including Pemba and Unguja. The event started in November, 2017. On October 21, 2018, 8 winners from the 1st Ladies First event were sent to Japan to participate in Nagai City Marathon, (Yamagata prefecture). Nagai City will be the host town of Tanzania at the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic games to be held in 2020. I hope many JATA members will attend and see the wonders of these ladies and congratulate them.

To conclude my message, I would like to congratulate you for your effort in making JATA active. I attended some of the activities which high ranking officials from the government were attended; this shows how JATA is now becoming popular. Involvement of JOCV volunteers is another area which I would also like to congratulate. By saying that as JICA ex-participants, I remind you that you have a great role to play in contributing to the development of your country by fulfilling your responsibilities; utilizing the technology and experiences you got from Japan or other countries under JICA's programme.
