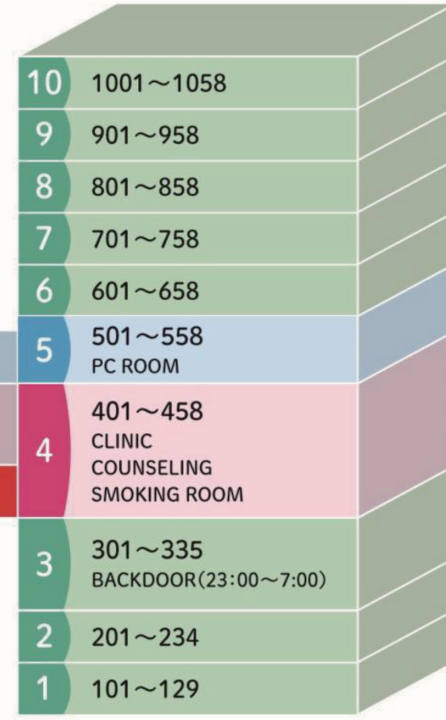

TIPS for Earthquake Safety

When you are in... JICA Tokyo

Keep Calm

Panic may cause you injuries

- Be careful of fallen objects or shattered glass
Broken glass, signboards may fall down and hit you
- Stay inside and wait for announcements/instructions from JICA Tokyo Center



Protect yourself first

- Be prepared and protect yourself from an earthquake when you hear Warning announcement or feel a quake
 - Stay under a table until quake is gone
Keep yourself from falling or moving objects during quake
- Upper Floors may be shaken for several minutes.

Outside

- Use a bag or hand luggage to protect your head.
- Get away from structures like concrete-block walls, and watch out for falling objects such as bricks, glass, or signboards.
