## **JICA Volunteer Program**













#### **Overview**

JICA's volunteer program is one of Japan's technical cooperation schemes operated as part of its Official Development Assistance (ODA). The Program dispatches eager Japanese citizens who wish to participate in assisting developing countries and also have the calls for assistance from their governments.

## **Objectives**

- [1] To cooperate on the economic and social development as well as the reconstruction of developing countries.
- [2] To deepen mutual understanding and coexistence in cross-cultural societies.
- [3] To give back the volunteer experience to society.

Since July 2001, Uganda has received 800 JICA Volunteers spread throughout the various regions in the fields of education, health, youth activities, agriculture, and community development. These Volunteers dedicate their efforts to raise and improve people's well-being. In March 2020, there were 48 Volunteers in Uganda supporting different sectors such as; Agriculture, Education, Community Development and Health.

#### Health

JICA Volunteers support Health Systems Strengthening by working as nurses, pharmacists, midwives and medical equipment technicians in Regional and District Hospitals. They work together with Ugandan counter-parts to improve health services and capacity development of health workers while sharing their experiences and relating them to the Ugandan situation.

#### **Education**

The Volunteers work as teachers in Primary and Secondary Schools, Primary Teacher Colleges and Vocational Training Institutes. In secondary education, they promote Physical Education thus instilling discipline, teamwork and good health for the learners. Also, science and mathematics teachers at secondary schools, cooperate with local teachers to motivate students' interests and curiosities by demonstrating scientific experiments using locally available materials. At Vocational Training Institutes, the Volunteers teach technical knowledge in their specialized fields. Through these trainings, students acquire a better experience, skills and become self-reliant personnel.

In primary education, the Volunteers mainly teach Mathematics and Physical Education to achieve the necessities in each grade.

#### **Agriculture**

Volunteers in agriculture work with the community people in their farms to maximize yields by introducing better farming techniques and handy farm equipment, sharing knowledge on pests and diseases, conducting research on improved seed varieties.

The program aims at elevating income and reducing poverty in rural communities particularly by value addition to agricultural outputs. The Volunteers work at District Production Offices, Community Based Organizations, and Refugee Settlement with UNHCR partner organizations. They also contribute to training personnel who will play active roles in their communities.
