UGANDA AND JAPAN ICT BUSINESS STUDY TOUR IN UGANDA

JICA Uganda in collaboration with the Ministry of Information and Communications Technology and National Guidance (MoICT & NG) held a week-long (29 January to 4 February, 2023) Business Study tour for a delegation of renowned Japanese ICT companies, with the purpose of understanding the ICT ecosystem, attracting investment, and finding potential companies for collaboration, among other objectives.

The ICT tour was born out of the signing of record of discussion (RD) for the "ICT Industry Promotion project" by MoICT & NG and JICA, in November 2022 that is meant to strengthen private-sector collaboration in ICT offshore development projects and build capacity of Ugandan engineers.

JICA Uganda and Soltilo Bright Stars (SBS) held another football class for girl teams in Pagirinya Refugee Settlement in Adjumani district on 21 January 2023., to select U16 team players.

The first class was held in May 2022 ahead of the TICAD CUP 2022. These classes aim at motivating players (both refugees and host community) and fostering peaceful co-existence and empowering girls in the settlement.

During the classes, Emmanuel Loki, an SBS Player and a former refugee shared his skills and experience in Kakuma refugee camp in Kenya and encouraged the players to chase their dreams.

At the end, the selected U16 players received sets of uniforms, footballs, keeper gloves and socks donated by Albirex Niigata Ladies, a WE league team in Japan.





CARD Regional Training



Twenty-one participants from nine countries successfully completed the Coalition for African Rice Development (CARD) regional training on 25 November 2022, at NaCCRI in Uganda.

The regional training on "Rice Cultivation in Sub-Saharan Africa" intended for Agricultural extension officers and researchers from Tanzania, Kenya, Ethiopia, Liberia, Sierra Leone, Ghana, Zambia, Sudan, and Mozambique, was organized by JICA Uganda/ PRiDe II project II Promotion of Rice Development & National Crops Resources Research Institute (NaCRRI) in partnership with CARD.

The training was conducted through lectures, hands-on sessions and field visits to rice farmers in districts of Bugiri and Butaleja. Participants deepened and broadened their knowledge of rice extension approaches by visiting the PRiDe demonstration sites, the Musomesa Field School (MFS) farmer fields, and interacting with Ugandan extension officers as well as farmers.

PRiDe Project II graduates 18 Trainers (Musomesa)

The Promotion of Rice Development (PRiDe) Project, Phase II Project held the final training and graduation session of 18 Trainers (MUSOMESA) at Rwamanja Refugee settlement.

The certified MUSOMESA involved members of the host community and refugees from DRC, Burundi and Rwanda.

The project seeks to build capacity for rice cultivation across the country through the Musomesa Field School (MFS), a farmer-farmer extension approach, as part of JICA's technical cooperation.
