- ✓ Assist and support Japanese expert during implementation of project.


Activities:

- ✓ Improve the local silkworm breeds.
- ✓ Introduce the Japanese silkworm breeds with sericulture systems.
- ✓ Develop a Manual of improved sericulture for Uzbekistan.
- Teach the pilot farmers the technique of breeding and screening cocoons using the manual. Develop teaching material
- ✓ Supply and install training equipment

Results (Expected for on-going projects):

- 1) Improved breeds of silkworm are introduced to the pilot farms by the project.
- 2) Farmers master good techniques in rearing silkworms and screening cocoons.
- 3) Market for high quality cocoon is established in Uzbekistan.

4) New products using silk and mulberry wood/fruit are developed and exhibited for sale at the antenna shops in Uzbekistan.
