JICA Volunteers in Zambia


Zambia was amongst the first countries in Africa to receive Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers, in the year 1970, barely four years after the JOCV program was inaugurated in Africa. The maiden group of volunteers to arrive in Zambia were 6 Judo instructors who were slated to assist Police training schools in Lusaka and on the Copperbelt, in the field of martial arts. Since the introduction of the program, the volunteers have been dispatched in a versatile manner to suit the developmental trends that the Country is going through and more specifically in the host line Ministries and the Government.

The Purpose of JICA Volunteer Programme

Milestones of JOCV programme in Zambia

- In 1978, the first female volunteer was dispatched to Zambia. Since then, the ratio of male to female volunteers reached a balanced 50 percent until 2020.
- In 2018, October, Zambia had the largest number of dispatched volunteers in the world, reaching an all-time high of almost 100 JOCVs. This increased number of volunteers in Zambia translated into improved coverage of Volunteer dispatch in different sectors to all provinces
- In 2019, 5th April, all volunteers resident in Zambia at the time were invited to pay a courtesy call on the President of Zambia, His Excellency Mr. Edgar Chagwa Lungu at State House. During this event, the President appreciated noble work that Volunteers render to the people of Zambia. The volunteers were able to share about their work and freely mingle with the President.

Core Activities 1

[Education] The activities of volunteers in Education may extend from assisting the learners to improve their scholastic proficiency in various subjects or working with regional educational departments to organizing teacher training programs to introduce alternative or new teaching methods. Currently we focus on Science and Mathematics education, Physical education and ICT.

Core Activities 2

[Agriculture] Volunteers contribute to improve productivity, food security, and increase profitability by introducing best practices, management systems and new techniques in each field. Currently we focus on vegetable growing, mushroom growing, rice cultivation and animal husbandry.

Core Activities 3

[Health]

Volunteers work to provide better health care and increased access to information through assisting in skills development of local health care professionals as well as promoting awareness of various healthrelated issues.

Currently we focus on MCH (Maternal and Child Health), HIV prevention and Public Health.

Core Activities 4

[Business administration] Volunteers help facilitate community development using various approaches such as establishing small income-generation projects with local groups to a create additional income. Additionally, volunteers with knowledge and experience public administration work in governments or other organizations to provide better services to its citizens and customers.
